The box score tells the story, Cheylin scored 22 points in the first quarter, 16 in the second quarter and seven in the third quarter, keeping Natoma scoreless the whole game.

Jeremiah White ran in five touchdowns in 200 rushing yards and had two tackles in the game. Walker Janicke caught a pass in the end-

zone and also had two tackles on the day. Austin Manners ran in two conversions, 29-yards rushing and had four unassisted tackles. Quarterback Kenan Reeh had two complete passes and ran in a conversion in 19 rushing yards. Noah Jones led the Cougars with five tackles and one fumble recovery and Ruben Razo kicked all six kickoffs and one extra-point.

The Cougars have a 6-1 record this season and will travel to Tribune on Friday to take on the Greeley County Jackrabbits.
