Saturday and Sunday. Saturday's tour went from south of Gove along the Smokey River. Most of this trail site is now on private land, so those on the tour were able to see things they normally wouldn't get to see. The group also attended the Caryl Station and Monument Station. On Sunday the tour went South

of Oakley and visited other station sites. They were fortunate enough to receive permission to go to the North and South Fork
