Mr. Burr pointed out the ditch on the east side of the highway had a lot of silt and needed to be dug out so the water can drain rather than back up. He also said the street lights need to be checked and Midwest Energy needs to be notified of any that need to be replaced.

Attorney Report

Kevin Berens, county attorney, read parts of the bid proposal for the removal of the building on Main Street that has been deemed unsafe. His suggestion was that they have a "Bid Conference" where all interested bidders could

be shown the structure at the same time pointing out what is to be required. Some of these bid requirements were that the water and sewer services should be cut off 5 feet from the property line and if there is any kind of septic system/cesspool or well that these must be plugged. A date for opening bids on demolition will be set at the December meeting.

Mayor Burr reported he will not be present for the December council meeting to be held on Dec. 12 at 7 p.m.
