"Since Bt (Bacillus thuringienmany changes," said K-State Research and Extension agronomist Kraig Roozeboom. "Now there are several different Bt products Bt hybrids.

Roozeboom, along with K-State entomologist Jeff Whitworth, gave tips for corn growers regarding Bt corn selection.

 Avoid using hybrids with traits that are not necessary. Using such hybrids will increase sis) corn first came on the market the chances of insects developseveral years ago, there have been ing resistance to the traits. For example, producers who are not in a continuous corn system probably do not need corn rootworm trolled or suppressed in a hybrid.

 Consider rotating hybrids with a given insect. Much like rotating different classes of insecticides, it doesn't hurt to use hybrids with different events and different modes of action for a specific pest. For example, the Agrisure, Herculex/Optimum and Yield-Gard/Genuity hybrids use different events. This may help delay resistance. It's also important to pay attention to whether an insect is con-

 Follow refuge requirements different Bt proteins (events) for for the various traits and trait stacks as applicable to their location. Their seed suppliers should provide that information as part of the grower agreement.
