Flexible vacuum

Ag Talk with Jeanne

Stripe rust is still being found in trace levels in the wheat throughout the area. This is being found on the first and second leaves below the flag leaf. In addition it is not being found on every plant, but will likely be found upon entering a field.

During the stripe rust infections in 2012, varietal resistance was a common theme. This year, stripe rust has changed and is now attacking previously resistant varieties. Those varieties include TAM 111 and Armour. In addition, it appears that the varieties with Jagger parentage are being slightly less affected. However, these varieties are still exhibiting stripe rust. Finally, Winterhawk is a variety that is rated resistant. Stripe rust has been found in Winterhawk, but it seems to still have some resistance.

Stripe rust is most detrimental

to yield, when it is infecting the flag leaf. The flag leaf contributes approximately 75 percent of the nutrients that are used in filling the wheat head. In addition, the timing of infection to the flag leaf affects the stripe rust's effect on yield. As a rule of thumb, the earlier the stripe infestation the greater the affect on yield. Losses are greater when stripe rust infects the flag leaf at flowering (30-percent yield loss with 65-percent flag leaf infestation) than at the soft dough stage (7-percent yield loss with 65-percent flag leaf infestation).

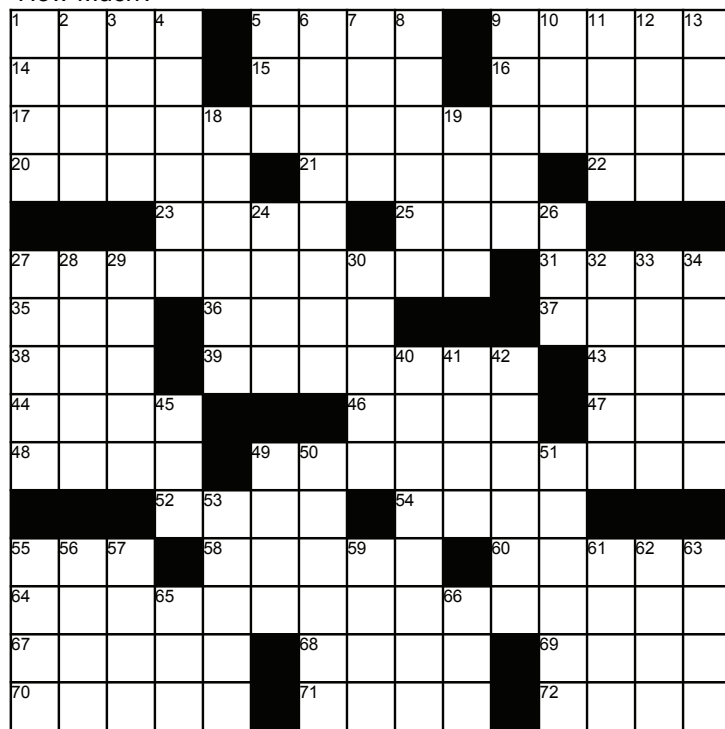
