

Cheylin graduate receives historical society scholarship

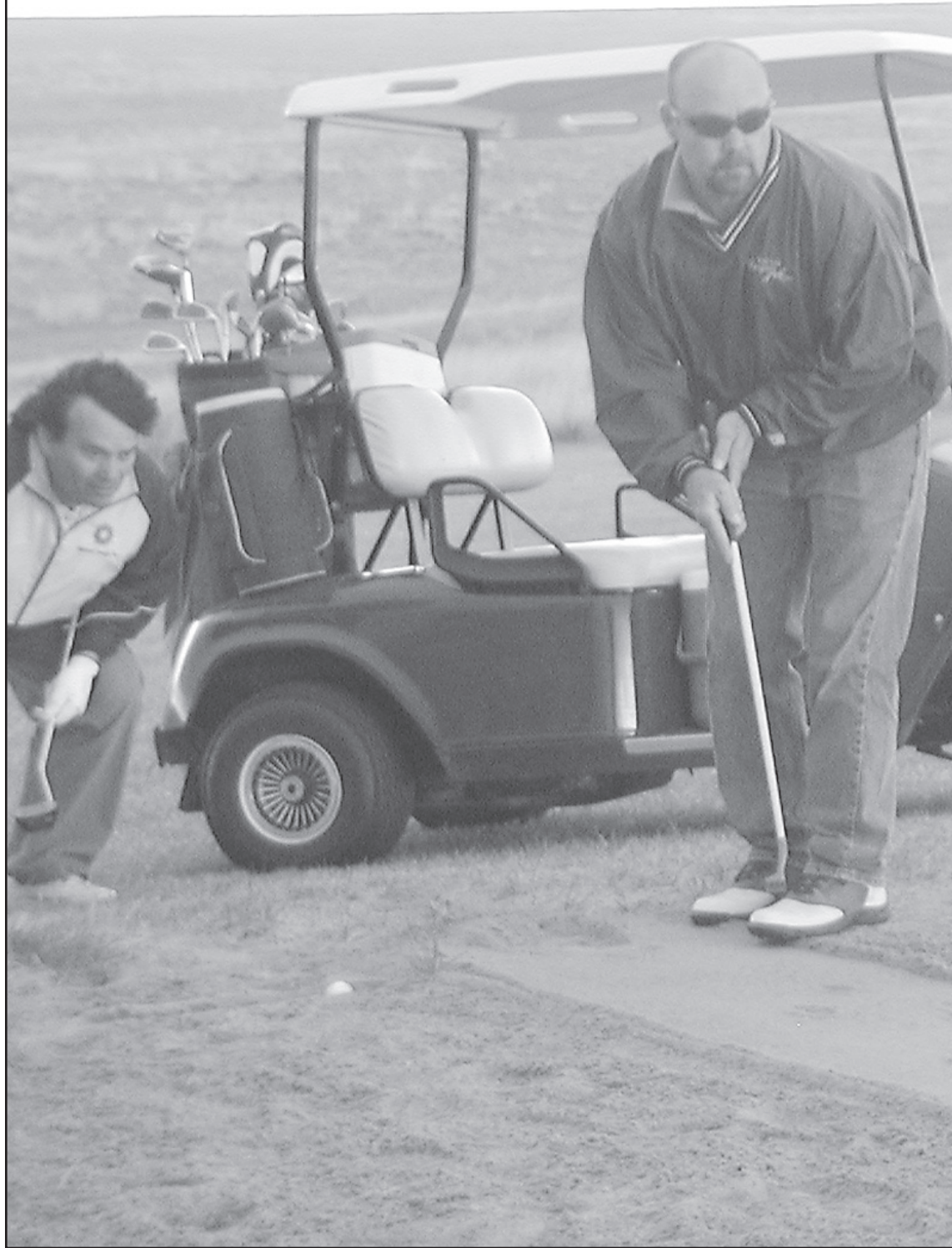
Historical Society scholarship
 Jessica Turner, graduate of Cheylin High School, was named the 2012 recipient of the Cheyenne County Historical Society Scholarship. Seniors from St. Francis and Cheylin high schools competed for the \$500 scholarship. One of the requirements is that the recipient attended school in Cheyenne County.
 Another requirement of the application for the scholarship is to write an essay on why it is important to know the history of Cheyenne County. The six judges all agreed that most of the essays they received this year were unusually well-written.
 Jessica started her essay by saying, "I believe that though Cheyenne County is not densely populated, or wealthy in terms of worldly goods, it is indeed blessed with a rich heritage."
 Later, she goes on to say, "It is very easy to become distracted by the pressures of our modern world. I feel that having a working

knowledge of your history keeps your feet grounded when you are on your own in the world. There is nothing like a western Kansas sunset to put everything in perspective!"
 And she concludes with, "I feel it is important to know where you come from because this helps you know where you want to go in life. Remembering the struggles and work ethic of my ancestors will remind me of how lucky I am."
 Jessica plans to go to Colby Community College and then on to Kansas State University. She wants to major in apparel marketing and says, "I would like to become a clothing buyer for a larger retail store. I believe it is vital to choose a career that I am passionate about, and to pursue my dreams through continued education." Jessica is the daughter of Mike and Melissa Dart.
 This is the sixth year the Historical Society has offered this scholarship. The first year Brittany Lucas was awarded \$250.

Golf tournament is well attended

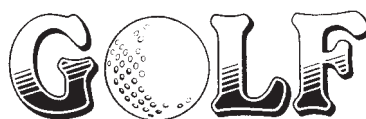

 Jerry Dean Weinstein, 58, was born at Cheyenne County Hospital on Jan. 26, 1954, to Jack and Nancy Weinstein. He attended school in St. Francis until sixth grade when he moved to Denver with his family. After leaving school he enlisted in the Army and spent most of his enlistment in Germany. When his time in the service was over he attended Goodland VoTech graduating with a degree in electronics.
 In 1980 he was married to Kristie Bexley. To this union five daughters were born. Jerry worked in pivot irrigation while daughters were growing up. Later he moved to the Arizona Mountains that he loved. He was a thinker and inventor. He also was a very good artist and could draw or paint anything.
 Early in 2009, he was diagnosed with colon cancer and had successful surgery but a short time later the cancer was back. All of his treatments were done at the Veterans' Hospital in Prescott, Ariz.
 He died on April 24, 2012, with daughters at his side. He leaves to mourn his daughters: Marla Weinstein, Amanda Bruback, Kelsey Weinstein, Mallory Weinstein and Hailey Weinstein. They make their homes in Phoenix and Las Vegas, his mother Nancy, brothers Jack L. St. Francis, Terry (Diana) Bird City, Randy (Joan) Denver, and sister Judy Ewing, St. Francis. His father preceded him in death.
 Jerry was cremated and no services were held.
