July Fourth celebration plans set

The July Fourth celebration is just a couple of weeks away and plans are falling in place fast. The first half of the fireworks have arrived and, as of the first of the week, six out of the 10 entries for the hot dog contest had been filled.

Time is running out to enter the hot dog contest. The winner will have 12 minutes to eat as many hot dogs plus the buns as fast as they can. The first place winner will receive \$50 in prizes plus 24 packages of hot dogs. Call Uptown Market, where the contest will be held at noon, to sign up, 332-2774.

There are two events starting the day at 7 a.m. The Sainty Sharks swim team will host a triathlon and the Cheyenne County Wildlife organization will hold a

fishing contest for kids 15 years and under.

The triathlon will be for children to adults with different distances to swim, run and bike. Margaret Poling, organizer, said individuals or teams can enter.

The adults or Super Spring, will be starting the triathlon with a 400-yard swim, followed by a 10K bike ride and 5K run.

Kids of Steel, the older kids, will swim 200 yards, bike 5K and run 2K. The junior Kids of Steel, kids 8 and under, will swim 100 yards, bike 2.5K and run 1K.

The triathlon starts at the pool with registration and the swimming competition. The routes will be marked and there will be maps.

At the top of the hill north of town there will be buckets of water for the bikers to splash over them. From there, the bikers will turn around and head downhill back to the pool.

Everyone is encouraged to bring lawn chairs or blankets for seating.

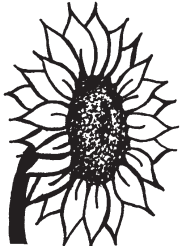

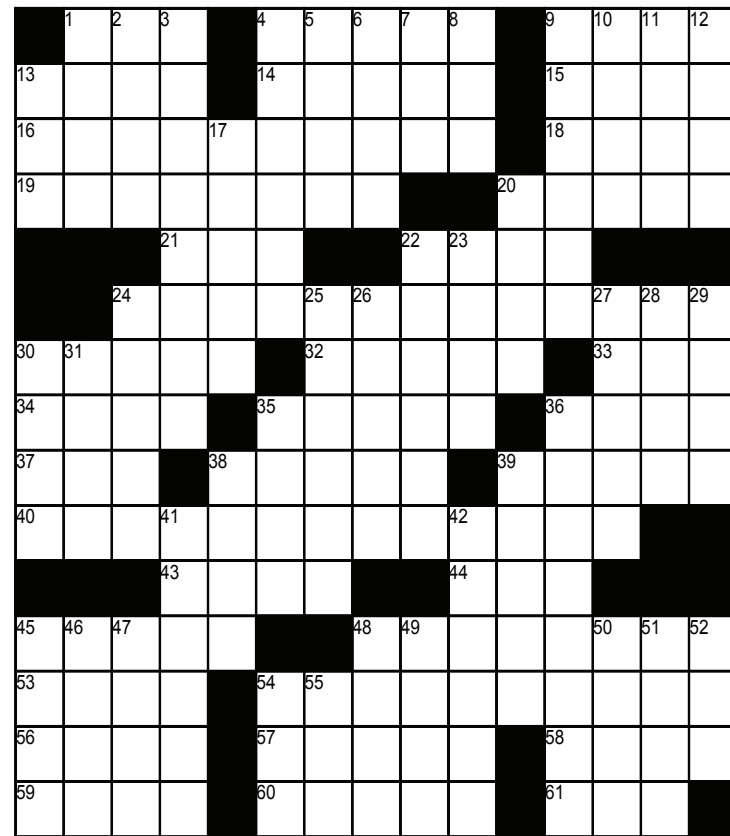
