# **Hospital Administrator to resign**

Hospital administrator Les Lacy tendered his resignation of the position, effective the first of October. He will continue to be active in the hospital and community as he is taking over Jackie John's role as Vice President for Regional Operations for Great Plains Health Alliance.

Money had to be borrowed from the funded depreciation account to make June payroll. Mr. Lacy has been invited to


