

Landfill supervisor present at commissioners' meeting

The new landfill supervisor was present at the Tuesday, July 31, Cheyenne County Commissioners' meeting.

Adam Peter, supervisor, said there is a huge pile of lumber at the landfill. He was wondering what to do with the lumber. He had given some of it away and was interested in giving more away. The commissioners suggested that Adam market the lumber as "burnable" lumber.

They discussed that painted lumber could not be put in the tree pile. He also needed to be careful that things such as calking gun cartridges end up in the construction and demolition pit.

Mr. Peter said that in the future as dumping rules are enforced, there will need to be two employees at the landfill.

Getting a compactor for the landfill has been discussed several times at prior commissioners' meetings. Mr. Peter said that a compactor would do a better job than the loader is doing. By compacting the trash, it would save 30 to 40 percent on space

thus, the landfill will not fill up as quickly.

Dave Flemming, road and bridge supervisor, had information on used compactors but they had a lot of hours of use. Andy Beikman, commissioner, said he was not in favor of buying one of the used compactors as he felt that they would be putting in a lot of repairs. The compactors are extremely big and heavy, consequently, they would be hard to transport and it would be expensive to have someone come in and fix them. There is a company which the county has dealt with before that rebuild and certifies the equipment. Mr. Flemming will look at what they have to offer.

"We need to get something that will last 10 years," Mr. Beikman said.

Blowing trash was one of the violations the county was cited on by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. More fence is needed so Mr. Peter will get prices on metal pipe. He would like to get the fence up before winter and the ground freezes. They talked about making screens out of chain-link fencing which

can be pulled over the trash piles to keep paper and plastics from blowing.

They talked about the need for an operating plan. Several names of people to contact for examples of plans were discussed. The plan will be put in place when they have one ready.

In other business

In other business: County attorney, Kari Gilliland, said that the Good Samaritan Society had not given any more information on insurance costs for the nursing home facility.

Roger Jensen, St. Francis city councilman, and J.R. Landenberger, St. Francis city superintendent, talked about the recycling center located in St. Francis. See related article for more information.

The next meeting of the commissioners will be at 8 a.m. on Monday, Aug. 13, when they canvass the votes from the primary election. The next regular meeting will start at 8 a.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 15, in the commissioners' room in the courthouse.


