Travelers and bargain and your crafts ready for the Holiday antique hunters will be rolling into St. Francis on Thursday night to get a head start on the U.S. 36 Treasure Hunt which starts Friday and lasts until Sunday.

The U.S. 36 Treasure Hunt, which runs along U.S. 36 from the Colorado border to the Missouri border, will start Friday, Sept. 17, and run to Sunday, Sept. 19. There are around 35 people listed on the vendor's map which can be obtained in St. Francis at the mailbox on 300 S. Benton, at the extension office in the courthouse and at Majestic Service; and, in

Bird City at Hometown Market. There are several locations which are not listed on the map but they will be having sales, too. Look for signs. There is a special section on the classified page.




