In November 1962 the Type I polio is a rare disease of concern, and health care workers are more concerned with everyone getting shots for the flu and pneumonia. "We love Dr. Allard," said Mr. DeJong, who said their last baby was also born at the hospital and delivered by Dr. Allard.
