Currently, the make up for the selection process of Supreme Court justices is: four of the Commission's members are nonattorneys appointed by the Governor, and four others are attorneys selected by attorneys in each of the State's four Congressional Districts. The Chair of the Commission is an attorney elected by attorneys in a statewide vote.

The motivation for this proposal is that a previous Kansas Supreme Court ruled that the legislature didn't meet its constitutional duty to adequately finance public education. The ruling forced lawmakers to spend millions of dollars into kindergarten through 12 education.
