# **County health nurse gives** tips on controlling bed bugs

#### **By Mila Bandel County Health Nurse**

Recently there have been bed bugs found in Cheyenne County. Humans are generally responsible for introducing bed bugs into new areas; they have a limited home range, and spread slowly by themselves. So with some "will power," you should be able to eliminate the infestation using an integrated pest management approach.

Bed bugs are small, oval, nonflying insects that bite people. Bed bugs have flat bodies and may sometime be mistaken for ticks or small cockroaches. Bed bugs feed by sucking blood from humans or animals. Adult bed bugs are reddish brown in color, appearing more reddish after feeding on a blood meal.

Bed bugs can live in any area of the home and can live in tiny cracks in furniture as well as on upholstered furniture. They tend to be most common in areas where people sleep and generally concentrate in beds, including mattresses, box springs, and bed frames. They do not infest the sleeping surfaces of beds as commonly as cracks associated with the bed frame and mattress.

Other sites where bed bugs often live include curtains, edges of carpet, corners inside dressers and other furniture, cracks in wallpaper (particularly near the bed), and inside the species of wicker furniture. They are also found in clothing and bedding.

They spread by crawling and may contaminate multiple rooms in a home. They may also be present in boxes, suitcases, or other goods that are moved from place to place or from a hotel to home. Bed bugs can live on clothing from infested homes and may be spread by a person unknowingly wearing infested clothing.

Although bed bugs are not known to transmit disease, they are a pest of significant public health importance. Bed bug bites can be very itchy and irritating. Most welts heal in a few days but in unusual cases, the welt may persist for several weeks.

Bed bugs are sensitive to is the best approach to getting extreme temperatures in all of their life stages; the young are more vulnerable than the adults. Throw your sheets, pillowcases, bed skirt, and blankets into a hot (140° F) dryer for 20 minutes to kill bed bugs.

Steam cleaning is another option You should search for feces, if it is done thoroughly at a high temperature. Move your bed away from the wall, and make sure the linens, bed skirt, and blankets do not touch the floor.

You may also want to slip the mattress into a cover that zips closed all the way around. Make sure all cracks are filled with caulking, repair or remove peeling wallpaper, and tighten any light switch covers.

Whatever techniques you use them time. It's extremely difficult to penetrate all of the bed bugs' working - it will take one week to creases, folds and around any tufts 10 days for getting rid of the pests.


