Prescription drug drop off planned

On April 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Cheyenne County Sheriff's office and the Drug Enforcement Administration will give the public its sixth opportunity in three years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your medications for disposal to St. Francis or Bird City Emergency Buildings. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last September, Americans turned in 244 tons of prescription drugs at over 5,200 sites operated by the drug administration and its thousands of state and local law enforcement partners. In its five previous Take Back events, the administration and its partners took in over 2 million pounds — over a thousand tons — of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish

in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse.

Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.

In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

Until new regulations are in place, local law enforcement agencies like the Cheyenne County sheriff and deputies and the drug administration officers will continue to hold prescription drug take-back events every few months.

Jalyn is a 2011 graduate of St. Francis Community High School and the daughter of Sean and Jenny Cravens, St. Francis.



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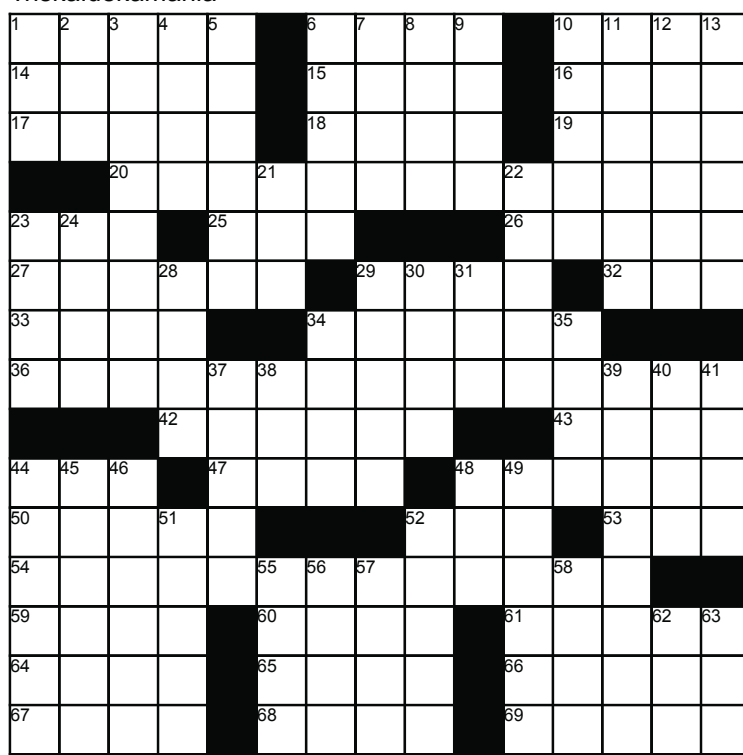
