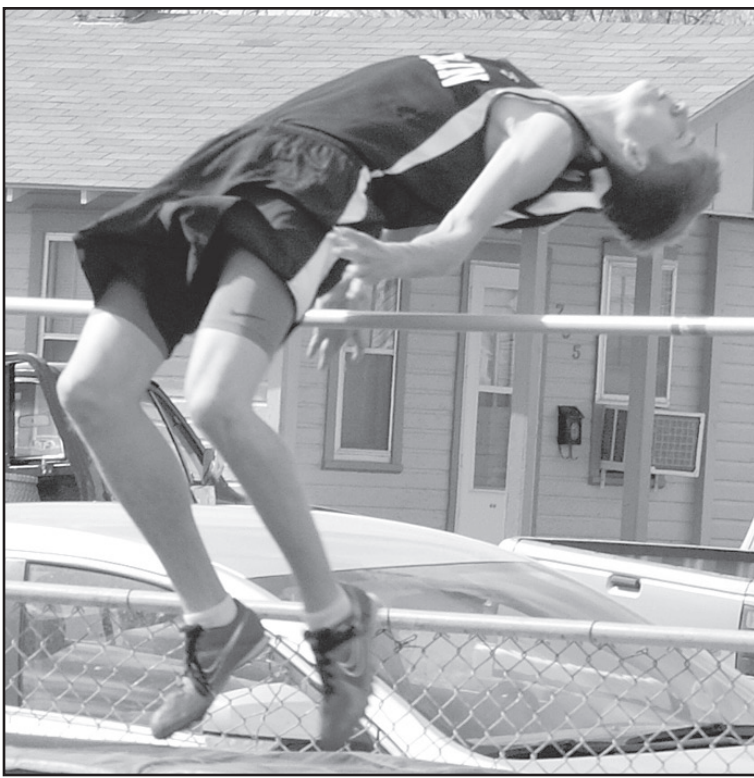
The choir is headed to Wichita this Friday for state choir. There is no further competition for band.

Now for the jocks. The Cougars track meet at Hoxie proved to be a good, learning first meet of the year. The Cougars finished last in both men's and women's team points.

The men corralled 75 team points and the ladies grabbed 49. Several individuals had good showings. Freshman Danae Magmani finished third in the high jump and seventh in the long jump. Freshman Diana Garcia finished sixth in the long jump. Freshmen Elizabeth Keltz placed seventh in the discus and fourth in the shot put. Sophomore Allie Frisbee had one of the best showings of any as she placed third in the 200m, second in the triple jump and long jump, and first in the 300m hurdle. Senior Stephanie Busse placed fifth in the 1600m. The ladies also put together a fifth place 4 by 100m relay.

Next comes the men. Freshman Devon Janicke finished seventh in the long jump, sixth in the triple-jump, and fourth in the 300m hurdle. Freshman Reece Leonard finished fourth in the 1600m and

Senior Adam Orten, who is in his first and last year of track, placed fifth in the triple jump, and second in the high and long jumps.

The Cougars furthered on their track success with a meet last Friday, placings for which will be reported next week.
