Commissioners discuss county airport

Ongoing improvements at the Cheyenne County Airport were discussed when the commissioners met on Wednesday, May 15.

Dave Yost, president of the Airport Commission, and Ron Louden, board member, talked about problems at the airport. The meeting was mostly just to inform the commissioners.

They said last summer's heat had taken a toll on some of the asphalt at the airport and the cracks will need to be filled. They said the commission had received money from the state to make those repairs.

The airport has been getting 95-5 matching grants and the wider, longer concrete runway was completed last year. There are two more major projects to be completed in the future including the taxiway and the "apron" for visiting planes.

Federal The Aviation Administration, Mr. Yost said, requires that the taxiway comes out at a 90-degree angle. This project will also be poured out of concrete. The county's share is construction of the apron has estimated to be \$58,000.
