Enjoy piano music at the old country church next door, where the church historian will be on hand to tell the church's story.

volunteer hours are helping make proposed projects become realities.

Lexan has replaced the broken window glass of the old church without taking away from the Prairie Gothic architecture. New glossy museum brochures are now traveling around the state, advertising this historic county resource. Tempered glass panels have been purchased to enhance the large display of period costumes.

A brick walkway connecting the old church and the museum is in the planning stages. Bricks taken

from downtown sidewalks are being donated by the city. Volunteers have been working this winter to bring new life to old exhibits.

Each year necessary expenses for the church and museum amount to nearly \$14,000. Of that, \$4,000 comes from a county allotment. The rest is made up by donations, book sales, fund-raisers, Historical Society memberships (\$10) and Friends of the Museum (\$25).

The Museum's purpose is to preserve our history and provide an interesting peek back at the lives of our ancestors.

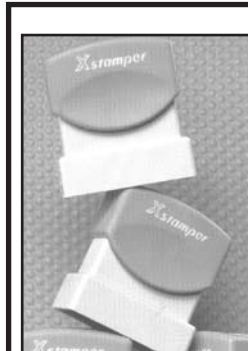

### Board accepts bid for metal roof covering

The Cheyenne County Fair Board met at the fairgrounds on Thursday evening for a special meeting concerning the metal roof covering over the show arena south of the livestock barn. At the end of the meeting, the board agreed to accept the bid of Krien Steel Buildings.

President Dick Bursch had three bids for a structure 60 by 110 feet. Bids were: Majestic Service, St. Francis, \$42,715 but didn't include the concrete which was an additional \$10,236, pushing the bid to 52,951; Malsom, Goodland, \$59,000; Krien Steel Buildings, \$46,629 and the bid included the cement.

Ron Krien and Wade Krien were present at the meeting. Ron said for another \$3,200, he could add another 6 feet, making the building 60 by 116 feet. His bid did not include the rain gutter. To put gutter on both the east and west sides of the roof, it would cost \$1,400.

Wheeler Equity had offered to loan the fair board up to \$45,000 to erect the structure and the

board would pay the Equity back in 10 years with 1-percent interest. With Krien's low bid, the board would need to come up with \$1,429 for the 60 by 110 foot building.

The board then discussed adding the extra length to the building, \$3,200, and adding guttering to the east side of the roof which was one-half the \$1,400 or \$750. The total cost of the structure would be \$50,379.

The board voted to accept Krien's bid of \$50,379. The additional money, \$5,379, over the \$45,000 loan, will be taken out of the board account. The first payment will be due on Sept. 1.

It was noted that an electrical pole on the south side of the livestock building will need to be removed. There is also a tree to remove which will be in the way of the building on the south side of the arena.

The materials would be ordered the following day. Krien said the company had assured him that the materials would be in St. Francis in time for construction before the fair began.

### Program cost-share signup ends soon

Landowners with natural resource concerns on their property are encouraged to visit the Cheyenne County Conservation District office to discuss the possibility of receiving financial assistance.

The county conservation district is conducting a cost-share sign-up May 20 through June 14, to accept requests for state financial assistance to install enduring conservation practices. The conservation district administers state cost-share programs locally to improve water quality and reduce soil erosion. Funding is provided by the Kansas Department of Agriculture - Division of Conservation.

Natural resources concerns that are eligible include terraces, grassed waterways, field windbreaks, grass plantings, livestock water supplies, cross fencing, septic systems, and abandoned well plugging. The sign-up does not guarantee approval of cost-share financial assistance. Projects started or completed prior to being approved for funding are not eligible for these funds.

Following the sign-up deadline each request is carefully reviewed to ensure eligibility. The proposed project is ranked according to a system developed by the county district. The ranking system en-

sure fairness to landowners and ensures cost-share funds are used to meet local conservation priorities. Landowners approved for the program are notified of the practice(s) approved and the estimated amount of cost-share that will be provided. Before the work can begin the contract must be approved by the division of conservation and must be signed by the landowner(s).

The Conservation District works closely with the Natural Resources Conservation Service to protect and conserve natural resources, primarily soil and water. Conservation practices funded with state cost-share funds must be installed and maintained according to specifications. It is necessary that landowners work closely with Natural Resources Conservation Service in the planning stages to ensure practices are applied correctly. Technical assistance for these practices is provided free of charge by the Department of Agriculture.
