During these three days the focus was on teaching elite and basic basketball skills to help Cheylin take the next step in its basketball program. Both offense and defense skills were taught with emphasis on communication, competition and concentration.

Louie Krogman came from White River, S.D., where he played four years at the University of South Dakota. During those years he was all-time scoring and

3-point leader from 3,500 college basketball players in the state.

Joel Lincoln came from Davenport, Iowa, and is a former coach at Northwest Missouri State University.

Isabelle Gabaldon took 3rd in the 25 meter freestyle with a time of 30.15 seconds. Andrew Schields took 2nd in the 25 meter butterfly with a time of 37.73 seconds, 3rd in the 50 meter freestyle with a time of 53.16 seconds and 4th in the 25 meter freestyle with a time of 23.02 seconds.

Jacob Serrano took 3rd in the 50 meter backstroke with a time of 65.42 seconds and 8th in the 50 meter freestyle with a time of 59.07 seconds.

John Serrano took 2nd in the 25 meter backstroke with a time of 30.99 seconds, 3rd in the 50 meter backstroke with a time of 42.52 seconds and 1st in the 25 meter freestyle with a time of 22.61 seconds.

Briana Vandike took 1st in the 25 meter butterfly with a time of 41.27 seconds, 11th in the 25 meter backstroke with a time of 47.15 seconds, and 5th in the 25 meter freestyle with a time of 26.07 seconds.

The relay took 1st in the 100 meter freestyle relay with a time of 118.54 seconds. Members
