St. Francis to hold 125th celebration with plenty of activities planned

After weeks of planning, St. Francis' 125th Birthday Celebration has arrived! Activities will begin at 9 a.m. Friday morning with sidewalk sales on Main Street, games and vendors opening for business. Memorabilia will be sold in the building next door to Stuarts Jewelry.

Washington Street will be blocked off from Adams to Benton for the afternoon activities. Friday morning, Washington will be blocked off between the park and grade school for the children's events.

The theater will be open for viewing in the afternoon on Friday and Saturday, and again on Sunday afternoon for a Disney matinee.

The cake decorating contest will be held from 2 to 4 p.m. at Western State Bank with the judging following. The cakes will be served with the barbecue that evening.

The Art Walk-Druggin' Main With a New Twist starts at 4. See related article for more information. Glenn Zwegardt, former resident and nationally-known sculptor, will have art work on display at the Cheyenne Center for Creativity on Quincy Street and in Sawhill Park. At 7:30, he will dedicate a sculpture in the park, in honor of his parents, Gus and Martha Zwegardt, which will stay in St. Francis.

At 6 p.m., the barbecue starts. Headed up by Travis Jensen, the meat, has been slowly cooking for hours. It will be served with corn on the cob and baked beans. This is a free-will barbecue and there will be enough food to serve 1,500 people. Meat that is left will be auctioned off.

The beer garden will also open at 6. There will be a marked area including part of the park and the block of Dennison Street between Jackson and Washington streets where the beer can be taken and

after 8 p.m., beer can only be drank inside the basketball court.

There is a limit of two beers bought at one time. No other alcohol is allowed at the park or beer garden.

There will be a number of people as well as police officers on hand, making sure that those buying and-or drinking beer are 21 or older.

At 8 p.m., the bands will be judged in front of the basketball court. Prizes will be awarded.

Also, from 8 to midnight on both Friday and Saturday, there will be a street dance. Scott King will be the disk jockey.

Saturday

Saturday activities again start early with the Farmer's Market setting up at 7 a.m. and opening at 8 on the lot east of the theater. See related article for more information. The Fresh Seven Coffee cart will be serving coffee and the junior class will serve breakfast.

The St. Francis alumni golf tournament will start at 8 a.m. with registration. Prizes will be awarded at the St. Francis high school alumni celebration which starts at 6 p.m.

Again, there will be kids games vendors and sidewalk sales on Main Street. The Bike Rodeo will start at 9 a.m. at the courthouse. Kids should bring their bikes with them to the rodeo.

At the high school, there will be "touch-a-truck" activities where kids can look and touch the emergency vehicles - fire trucks and ambulances. Tentatively, Eagle Med plans to fly in a helicopter. Kids and adults should enjoy this activity.

There is a wedding that will be held in the band shell in the morning so after 10 a.m., no activities will be planned in that area. However, at the Cheyenne County Museum on U.S. 36, there will be a brat feed. People can

also enjoy walking through the museum and old country church.

From 6 to 8 p.m. Saturday evening, St. Francis alumni, spouses and friends will gather at the high school for a banquet and photos.

From 8 to midnight, another street dance will be held at the park with Mr. King providing the music. The cost of both street dances is being paid for by the alumni association.

Sunday

Sunday, there will be a church service at the Old Country Church. The sermon will be given by Marvin Zimbelmen

From noon to 5 p.m., the Cheyenne County Wildlife organization will hold a trap and five-stand shoot, open to the public. There will also be a 22 long rifle steel silhouette shoot. See ad for more information.

There will also be a Disney matinee at the theater starting at 2 p.m.

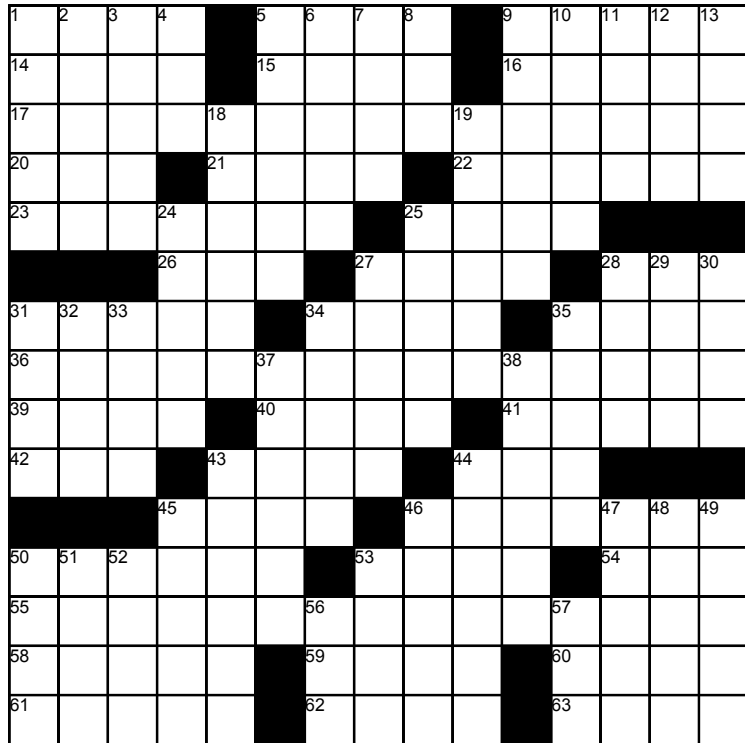
