On the way back to the guest house, they were able to visit an all-boys orphanage and plane had caught on fire in Haiti and the talk with them and share some of the toys they brought.


On Friday, the team set out for Mirrebalais. showing would take place. Upon returning on Saturday, they stopped at a feeding program for children.
