chance for fires. Anyone starting a fire outside the St. Francis and Bird City city limits or anywhere else in the county, whether it be a ditch fire, trash, charcoal grills, can be fined up to \$500 or one month in jail or both.

Hot temps continue

Temperatures have been 100 degrees and over for the last week. Kathy Woodcox, St. Francis reports that there could be a slight weather observer, reported five days of temperatures over 100 with the highest being 110 degrees on June 24. The National Weather Service is forecasting 100 degrees and up through Monday.

The wind, for the most part, has the fire ban is in effect. blown an average of 15 to 20 miles

an hour with gusts anywhere from 30 to 50 miles per hour as a dry storm or two moved through the area.

The hot weather is great harvest weather and farmers are trying to get the wheat cut as quickly as possible. However, the pastures are suffering.

Fires

Firemen in the area and surrounding area have been fighting fires. George Harper, St. Francis fire chief, reminds people that it is dry and there is a high fire danger. Be careful, he said, as it just takes a spark to tender a fire.

This resolution shall be in effect from the date of execution until such time as it is modified or rescinded by the Board of County Commissioners.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby declare that it shall be unlawful to violate this resolution and that any person found to be guilty of violating this resolution shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500.00 or confinement in the county jail not to exceed one month or both
