

Fun run held during show

While the Tri-State Antique Engine and Thresher Show celebrated its 60th anniversary, the Fun Run celebrated its fifth with a T-shirt slogan that celebrated both "Two great traditions – still running."

It was the coldest and windiest run on record, but it also boasted the most runners in Fun Run history. Ninety-eight people registered and 86 of them braved the wind to run or walk the course. They hailed from Idaho to Texas.

The Cheylin High School volleyball team, Brendan Haack, Clint Bursch, Hal Antholz, and C.J. The 2-Mile Blue youth winners were: Garrett Wilkens from Gunter, Texas, 21:18.00 and Ben Vyzourek from North Platte, Neb., 26:09.69. Women: DeeDee Wilkens from Gunter, 20:43.21 and Betty Jo Shults from Bird

City, 26:45.21. Men: Ben Baird from Brewster, 15:10.98 and Marshall Schottler from Lyons, 18:08.85.

The 1 Mile Green winners for the youth were: Andrew Schields, Bird City, 14:15.96 and Matthew Hendricks, Bird City, 14:22.18. Women: Darci Schields, Bird City 19:54.99 and Amy Dorsch, Wichita, 22:03.50. Men: Troy Chapman from Emporia, 15:56.40 and James Dorsch, Wichita, 22:02.93.

Volunteers are needed to help run carnival

The Cheyenne County Fair has arrived but, there are still nine rides and games that do not have volunteers to run them on Saturday evening. If those slots are not filled, then they will be closed down for the remainder of the evening.

Raedell Winston, who has been organizing the roster of names and carnival rides and games, reported that people are needed to run the Pop Toss, Duck Pond, Skeet Ball, Water Ball, Pro-ball Toss, Ferris Wheel and both the Big and Kids Swings. The time slots are 8 to 10 and 10 to midnight on Saturday. Each of the rides and games need

two people. Couples, friends or individuals, if they possibly can help during that time need to call Raedell at 332-4391.

Those who have already committed to run a ride or game need to show up at the appointed time.

The Amusement Authority members, in the past, have been able to take a shift if there is a "no show" but this year, with only six members, it is impossible. If no one shows up, the game or ride will need to be shut down until the volunteers come for the next shift.

The lack of volunteers has been a problem through the years but is serious this year. The carnival cannot run without dependable volunteers.

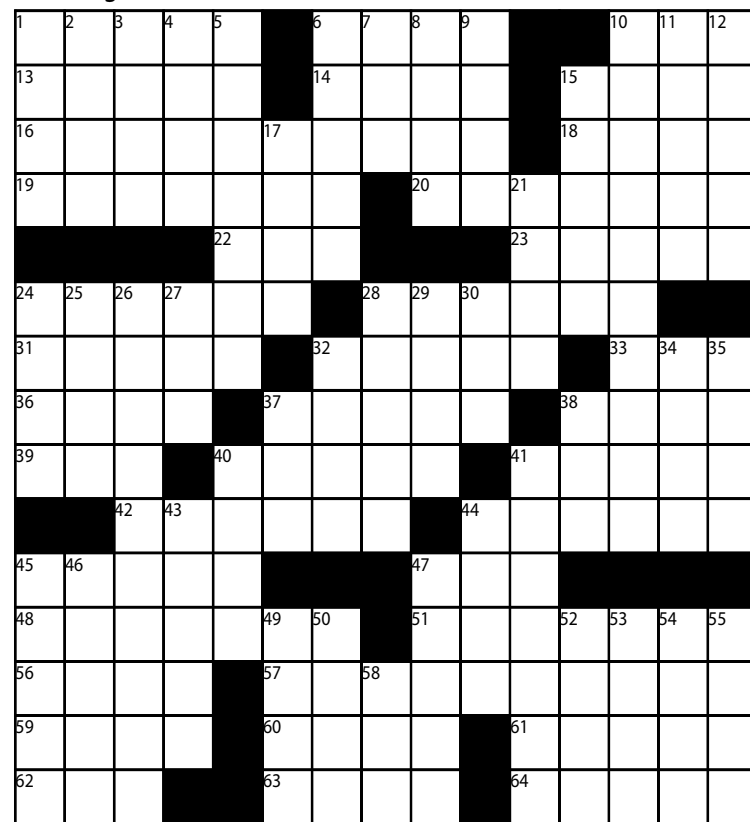
