Cheylin Site Council establishes goal

The Cheylin Site Council met Monday, Sept. 9, in the high school library. Members in attendance included: Superintendent/Principal, Shelly Angelos; Kelly Leach, Lori Janicke, Morgan Kauten, Kayla Bursch, Jeri Antholz, Darla Dible, Linda Schneider, Belinda Serrano, Dan Carson, and Carol Partch.

Mrs. Angelos reviewed the purpose of the council, noting that it serves as a line of communication between the school, parents, and the community. The goals of the council is to assist in providing a rigorous curriculum for students, to monitor school performance, to positively engage the community, to provide leadership, to deliver effective educators, and to strive

for continuous improvement. Since Mrs. Angelos became superintendent, several changes have been implemented: the teacher evaluation tool, the format of faculty meetings, a new seminar schedule, morning announcements, school security, the implementation of the AimsWeb Assessment Tool in reading and math for grades kindergarten through sixth, and an improved online curriculum.

The group voted unanimously that Dan Carson would assume the role of chairperson, with Carol Partch agreeing to be the secretary. Meetings are scheduled for Sept. 9, Nov. 4, Jan. 13, March 3, and May 5. These dates all appear on the school calendar.

Suggestions for possible council goals were to: assist the faculty with curriculum review, make sure that assessment information is provided to all parents, see that all classrooms have the necessary equipment and technology training, have council minutes put in the Atwood and Bird City newspapers, check into the possibility of having grades 5-8 involved in the Ameritown

activities in Wray, and research the possibility of having someone teach a conversational Spanish class. Interested parents or community members of the Cheylin school district are welcome to participate in sSite Council. The next meeting will be Oct. 7, at 4:30 p.m. in the high school library.

2. Billing for the same thing twice.
3. Services that were not ordered by your doctor.
