Influenza Season Facts

Flu seasons are unpredictable in a number of ways. Although epidemics of flu happen every year, the timing, severity, and length of the season varies from one year to another.

Flu viruses are constantly changing so it's not unusual for new flu virus strains to appear each year. This year's flu vaccine is designed to protect against the influenza viruses that experts predict will be the most common during the upcoming season.

Three kinds of influenza viruses commonly circulate among people today: Influenza A (H1N1) viruses, influenza A (H3N2) Each year, these viruses are used to produce seasonal influenza vaccine.

Signs and symptoms of the flu include; fever or feeling feverish/ chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, fatigue and some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults. Please note that not everyone with flu will have a fever. Flu viruses spread mainly by droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These

droplets can land in the mouths or and have no respiratory problems. noses of people who are nearby. Less often, a person might also get flu by touching a surface or object that has flu virus on it and then people who have severe allergy touching their own moth, eyes or possibly their nose.

The single best way to prevent the flu is to get a flu vaccine each season. There are two types of flu vaccine: 1) inactivated vaccine (containing killed virus) that are given with a needle. Some people should not be vaccinated without first consulting a medical provider. They include: to chicken eggs, people who have had a severe reaction to an influenza vaccination in the past.

Children younger than 6 months of age. People who have a moderate or severe illness with a fever should wait to get vaccinated

People with a history Guillain-Barre Syndrome severe paralytic illness) that occurred after receiving an influenza vaccine should not generally receive the vaccine.
