WTAP is a voluntary, incentive-based program designed t elp restore aquifers and streams in critical areas by retirin ater rights. Six "high priority" areas in the Northwest Kar roundwater Management District No. 4 (GMD 4) have be esignated as eligible target areas by the Kansas Departme of Agriculture's Division of Water Resources chief engine ecause of significant water level declines. The six areas l been determined to be in need of aquifer recovery and are no closed to further water appropriations

Applicants who are selected for WTAP grants are compensated by the department's Division of Conservation in exchange for the permanent retirement of water rights on irrigated land.
