Suspect's trial date moved to July 14

amiller@nwkansas.com The District Court of Cheyenne hearing to clarify, on written County heard motions from the record, the reasons for the court's defense and prosecution in the Windell case on Jan. 16. Once all sides were heard, the judge decided to change the trial date.

Windell pled not guilty to the charge of premeditated murder in the first degree in the death of Brad Figgins. Figgins, 45, was found in the basement of his home the evening of April 3, 2013, with injuries to his head. He was taken by ambulance to the hospital, and later pronounced dead. The penalty for that charge is 25 years to life in jail.

District Court Judge Scott Showalter presided over the court date. Present were the defendant Leanna Windell with her defense attorney Charles Peckham. Also present for the prosecution was Assistant Attorney General Nicole Romine.

The defense asked for a transcript of the December decisions on the various motions. The request came because the journal entries from that date refer to the record, rather than specifying reasons for decisions. Judge Showalter asked the court reporter to prepare a transcript of court on motions H through M for the defendant.

the defense also requested a continuance. Evidence that was found is currently being tested by the state, and the defense experts will need time to examine it. The defense argued that there will not be time available prior to the

After the court again advised the defendant of her rights to a speedy trial, Judge Showalter granted the defendant's motion. The jury trial has now been moved to July 14.


