Cheylin student wins spelling bee

St. Francis Grade School hosted the Cheyenne County Spelling Bee for the St. Francis and Cheylin schools. After a tough competition, Cheylin eighth grader Rachel Keltz walked away, winning the competition.

Cheylin seventh grader Alexandra Hazuka won the Cheyenne County Spelling Bee last year, making this the second year in a row that a Cheylin student has won the competition. Students in fourth through eighth grade participated, with the top three spellers in each class in the bee. Thirty participants began. Bruce Swihart conducted the bee, and began by announcing the rules. After the practice round, each student has the opportunity to correctly spell the word given to them. If incorrect, they may go sit down with their class or parents. If correct, they sit back down and move forward to the next round. During the championship round, the student that spelled the last word correctly must then spell an additional word correctly, or everyone who was eliminated during that last round may return for a chance to win. The winner, therefore, had to spell two words correctly in a row to clutch the win.

The practice round gave all the students a chance to walk to the microphone and practice spelling a word. Most students spelled the word correctly, but all returned to their seats to begin the Spelling Bee.

The Cheyenne County Spelling Bee was then kicked off. Each student approached the mic and spelled their best. During the first round, four students were knocked out of the bee. The second round saw an additional two students leave.

The third round brought some more difficult words. One student misspelled "cohesive" and was eliminated. Another misspelled "introverted." The competition was getting more difficult. Eight more students were eliminated.

The fourth round began with 16 students. However, they were rapidly eliminated. One by one, students fell to difficult words such as "betrothal," "propulsion" and "extinguish." Ten more students were eliminated. Four students were left. Kyla Hicks from St. Francis, and Jacob Serrano, Rachel Keltz and Audrey Moore from Cheylin.

St. Francis' Kyla Hicks fell to the word "ragamuffin" in the next round. Cheylin's Audrey Moore misspelled "chancellor" to be eliminated.


The final two students, Jacob Serrano and Rachel Keltz from Cheylin, went back and forth many times before one student could complete the championship round by correctly spelling two words.

After seven rounds back and forth, Jacob stepped up and misspelled "guidelines" as g-u-i-d-l-i-n-e-s. After he was eliminated, Rachel approached the mic. She correctly spelled "hammock," and was given her second word. After she correctly spelled "squirmy," the auditorium erupted in applause.
