Brett Poling, commissioner, said Ed Marin at Heartland Air Conditioning and Heating, St. Francis, was going to submit a bid. He wondered if he still had time to turn in a bid. At least, he said, we would have a comparison. We don't know if \$31,200 is a reasonable bid or not.
