Despite placing no more players in the top five the Cougars were still able to take first as a varsity team. The four varsity team members whose scores were taken were: Casey

Vandike with a 78, Ty Carmichael with an 80, Connor Hazuka with an 85, and Jacob Brubaker with a 90. Eddie Frisbie and Ivan Kemp took part in Varsity competition as well. The Cougars had a combined team score of 333, which was one stroke better than Lacrosse, who placed second as a team with a 334.

Now for the men's results. Matayas Cimbulka got the bronze in the 400m. Reece Leonard placed fourth in the 3200m. Leonard and Cimbulka teamed up with Rusty Porubsky and Michael Barnett for a fourth place 4 by 400m relay. Walker Janicke was the top dog as he

took discus gold. Devon Janicke showed off his legs to snag bronze in the 100m. The men had 34 team points, placing them seventh in the 15 team field.

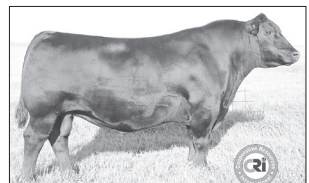

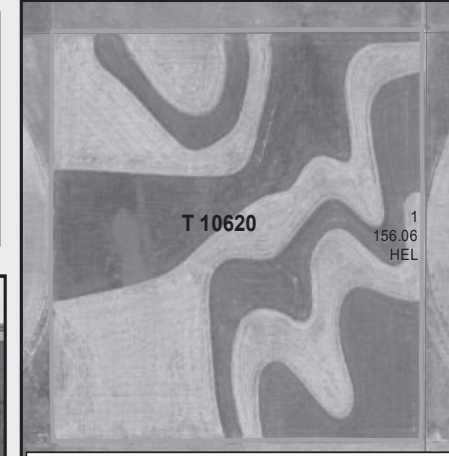
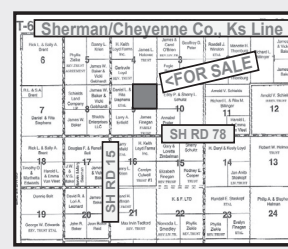
