Players hit the mark in All-Star game

Senior girls and boys basketball players from the Northwest Kansas area provided exciting action for fans in the 11th annual All-Star Basketball game on Sunday evening in the Community Building in Colby.

The girls dark jerseys rallied to win 70-66 and the boys light jerseys led most of the way in producing a 104-91 victory.

They led 38-33 at half-time but Kayla Beckman, a guard from Grinnell who had hit just 3 points in the first half, swished four baskets and a free throw early in the second half to fuel a light jerseys rally that gave them a 43-40 lead. The light jerseys were on top 54-44 with ten minutes left in the contest but Jackson helped narrow their advantage. With 3:15 left, Jackson scored to bring her team within two points at 60-58. After Trego's Erin Locke hit a free throw for the light jerseys it was 61-58 but Jackson scored again with 2:33 left to make it a 61-60 contest. The dark jerseys had the momentum, tied the score at 63-all and went on to win by four points.

Jackson ended with 6 points, 4 of them coming at a critical time.

The first main event up was the hobby stocks, which got off to a wild start at the drop of the green. Jamie Reiman of Blue Hill, Neb., got out of shape coming out of turn four for the green flag and spun in front of the grandstands. In the process, he collected Treva Patterson of Norton, and Bill Clanton of Salina slammed hard into the inside guardrail.

for the day, none of the drivers kept the field close, but each time were injured. Luke Wassom of Deshler, Neb., led the first three laps, before Cory Struckhoff of Kensington took the top spot. Several cautions forced race officials to cut the feature race from 12 laps to 10, and Rex Bonnett stayed on Struckhoff's bumper the last two laps but could not make the pass. Hometown driver Jason Davis led from start to finish in the 20lap stock car feature. McCreery and Jason Schoenberger. A couple of caution flags kept the field close, but each time Davis was able to pull away on the restart. As the field came out of turn four to the white flag, second place Damon Murty got caught up behind a lapped car, allowing Randy Clydesdale to take the runner-up spot. Murty finished third, fol-

The modified feature was shaping up to have an exciting finish, but with five laps to go, a caution flag waved and changed what could have been an interesting finish. At the drop of the green, polesitter R. Alan Dix of Stockton appeared to have something break on the right front of his race car, sending him hard into the turn one guardrail, bringing out a caution. On the restart, outside front row starter David Murray Jr. motored

to the front, chased by Bill Brack, Jason Friesen, Tim Watts and While all three cars were retired Brian Calhoon. Several cautions Murray was able to pull away from his competitors, that is until a caution for Will Brack on lap 18.

On the restart, Friesen stayed right on Murray's bumper and pulled alongside the two-time national champion. As the two came out of turn four on lap 21, the two made contact which sent Friesen spinning. Officials deemed Murray the cause, sending him to the back and giving Friesen the lead. Watts, who started 14th, stayed close to Friesen but was not able to make a pass and settled for second, trailed by Bill Brack, Marty Clark and Rick Schwab. Following the race, both Murray and Darin Schartz pulled into the claim area.
