The Dane G. Hansen Museum in Logan is hosting an exhibition of tin containers dating back to the late 1800s. The show is the result of 50 years of collecting by Liz Knitter, Downs.

Ms. Knitter began purchasing tin and cardboard containers from little shops here and there while living in California. What started with some neat old tea boxes, a Coors Malted Milk tin and a few attractive cosmetic tins, soon became a full-fledged collection. She now has nearly 1,600 tins and related items including tobacco, food product, pharmaceutical, candy, cosmetic, talcum, typewriter and household tins.

Highlighted in this show will be about 500 tins from her collection.

Ms. Knitter said that tins have become a desirable collector item.

She said that she collects tins for the beauty, nostalgia and just for the fun of it.

"Nostalgic Tins" will be on exhibit until Sunday, May 16, in the museum gallery and will show in conjunction with a second exhibit, "Parasols and Palmettos".
