

Papers honor players

State newspapers pick the best in basketball

Norton's Jered Sloan, Ryan Maddy, and Chelsea Cox, Logan's Val Jackson and Tyson Triplett, Northern Valley's Lindsey Graham, Jennings' Grant Bailey and Adam Miller are among the area high school basketball players who received 2004 post-season honors from the Salina Journal, Hays Daily News, Wichita Eagle and Topeka Capital-Journal newspapers.

Salina Journal

Jackson was chosen to the Salina Journal's All-Area Girls Top Five. A 6' senior forward/guard, she averaged 16.3 points per game.

"Val Jackson was a do-everything player for Logan, helping the Trojans to a 21-4 overall record, a perfect record in the Cheyenne Conference and a runner-up finish in the sub-state tournament," said the Journal. Jackson led her team in scoring, rebounding (8.2), assists (3.9) and blocked shots (4.0) while shooting 56 percent from the field and 82 percent from the free throw line.

"She has great fundamentals and uses those to her advantage against her opponents," the Journal quoted her coach Linda Nighswonger as saying. "She is a confident player. She also had the ability to find her open teammates when the opponent took away her shot. When we needed to score, we got the ball to Val."

Jackson will play basketball for Colby Community College, where she will major in special education.

Cox, Norton's 6' sophomore center and Graham received honorable mention from the Journal.

Sloan, a 6'4" senior center and Maddy, a 6'1" junior center, both received honorable mention along with Miller, Bailey and Triplett.
