Lola May (Woods) Smith, 99, great-grandmother of *Norton Telegram* reporter, Veronica Monier, died April 23 at Enterprise Estates Nursing Center, Enterprise. Mrs. Smith was born Sept. 29, 1904, in Tescott to Chester and Luella May (Horton) Woods. She lived in Iowa for a short time. She graduated from Tescott High School in 1924, and made her home in the Tescott area until her marriage to Earl. O. Smith on May 5, 1926. They farmed the Smith family land in Pleasant Valley Township near Culver, until their retirement in 1960. Following retirement, they moved to Salina where she continued to be active in the Ladies Aid Society and the Leisure Years. She crocheted throughout her life and donated many of her afghans. In March, she sent one to a family in Mexico. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband Earl
