# Farmers should check for nematodes

With everything farmers have to do in the spring, sampling for root lesions caused by nematodes seems like just one more thing, but it's an important step in ensuring a healthy corn crop.

Doug Jardine, K-State plant pathologist, says root-lesion nematodes can be a serious problem in corn in northwest Kansas.

Years of research suggest that there is a poor correlation between the numbers of nematodes in the soil and the potential for damage and yield loss to the corn crop. This makes diagnosis and management recommendations from soil samples alone a somewhat chancy process. Root sampling serves as a better alternative for detecting damaging populations of nematodes and provide a more reliable picture of the problem.

The optimum time for root sampling is about one month after planting. Jardine provides these tips for sampling:

• When sending a root sample, and healthy areas of the field.

• Include soil from the area di-

• Send the samples to the Plant Disease Diagnostic Clinic, Dept. of Plant Pathology, 4024 Throckmorton Hall, Manhattan, Kan., 66506-5502.

• The cost is \$13.40 if submitted directly or \$10 if sent through a county Extension office.

• Test results will be reported in numbers of nematodes per gram of root tissue.

Jardine says that farmers can expect a 1 percent yield loss for each 1,000 root-lesion nematodes. Management options are limited for the current year's crop, but root sampling will provide an accurate picture for determining the need include roots from plants in poor for a nematicide or crop rotation field. and high 20s on Thursday. When and look at the growing point. the temperature is at or below 30, severe damage to any headed wheat is probable, with some damage to emerged corn expected. Cold will likely cause floret sterility in some wheat, which will prevent development of the berry.

Awns or the whole wheat head could then turn white over the next few weeks. If the wheat head is wet from rain, this could provide some margin of insulation which in turn may prevent some damage. This all depends on how low the temperature actually was at the field and how long. Potential damage from the freeze will be discussed at the wheat plot tours.

For corn, the above-ground growth will likely be damaged, but the key is the below-ground growing point. If the growing point is intact and in good condition, the corn should recover without much problem. But if the growing point is damaged or dead (looks brown), then the grower should evaluate how much damage was done in a

To evaluate a field, one option rectly around the roots being tures dipped down into the low 30s would be to cut a corn plant open office.

The second would be to leave the field alone for seven to 10 days and see if leaves re-emerge from the whorl. If they do, little damage has been done to the corn. If they don't, then severe damage to the growing point has occurred.


