Beulah Arlene Falk, 79, of Oxford, Neb., died Sunday at the Phelps Memorial Health Center in Holdrege, Neb.

Mrs. Falk was born Dec. 9, 1924, on the family farm eight miles north of Oxford, the seventh of 14 children of William Otto and Minnie (Winter) Jauken.

She graduated from Mascot High School with the class of 1943. She received higher education through correspondence courses from the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago.

On Oct. 21, 1945, she married Maynard Lowell Falk at Trinity Evangelical Free Church in Holdrege. The family lived throughout Nebraska, Kansas and Wisconsin, serving in ministry.

Mrs. Falk worked with her husband until their retirement in 1991. She was active in many capacities in the churches, directing the choir, singing at funerals and weddings and assisting her husband.

She also worked as a grocery clerk in Obert, Neb., and in Rolla at The Tomato House and other part-time jobs to supplement the family income. She shared her love for crocheting with others and tended her vegetable and flower gardens.
