Busch Carp Derby set for July 17 and 18

The 24th annual Busch Carp Derby is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, July 17 and 18 at the Sebelius Reservoir west of

The weekend activities will center around the carp contest, as two-man teams of "archers" or "fishermen" attempt to bring in the legendary "Western Kansas Golden Trout".

A total of 554 carp were caught at last year's derby. The derby attracted 40 two-person teams from Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado.

The team of Travis Kohlrus, Ellis, and Roy Aschenbrenner, Ellis, won the championship by bringing in 88 carp for the two days and earning the first place \$150 cash prize.

The second place cash purse of \$100 went to Curtis Glenn, Norton and J.D. Sanderson, Norton, for bringing in 56 carp.

The team of Garry Staab, Hays, and Jeff Roberts, Concordia, placed third with 50 carp and received \$75 for their efforts.

Derby rules

The winners will be determined by counting the number of fish per team. One largest fish per team will be weighed each day. The combined weight of the big fish on Saturday and Sunday will be used for tie breakers.

Prize money

Approximately \$900 in prize money is being offered to the successful teams in the derby. The top 10 places will receive money.

Fishermen will be competing for a \$150 first place prize. The second place team will earn \$100 in cash and the third place team will take home \$75 in cash.

The additional cash awards per team are: \$70, fourth place; \$65, fifth place; \$60, sixth place; \$55, seventh place; \$50, eighth place; \$45, ninth place; \$40, tenth place.

The contestants will hit the water at 9 a.m. each morning of the two-day event. A weighin will be held at 6 p.m. on Saturday with the final weigh-in taking place at 3 p.m. on Sunday. No fishing will be allowed from 6 p.m. on Saturday until 9 a.m. on Sunday.

More prize money

A separate prize fund of \$100 has again been established by New Age Industrial Corporation, Inc., for any tagged carp caught by the contestants.

Fishermen turning in the tagged carp will share the fund. The color of the tag will be announced prior to the contest starting time.

In addition, a cash prize of \$50 will be awarded for the largest fish caught each day. The First Security Bank and Trust Company of Norton and Lenora is awarding this daily prize.
