

Elected were Fleta Hanlon, president; Ron Temple, vice president; and Olin Sprague, treasurer. They were installed at the July meeting held Tuesday.


Among other business, Mrs. Hanlon reported on plans for the craft fair on Nov. 13 at the Eisenhower Grade School.


