#### PROFILE #1 "Health Profile & CBC" — \$40.00

Health Profile Contains: ELECTROLYTES: (Sodium, potassium, chloride and total carbon dioxide). These are major indicators of kidney and hormonal functions. Electrolytes are essential for the body's acid-base balance and the operation of nerves and muscles, especially the heart.

KIDNEY FUNCTIONS: (BUN, creatinine). These indicators are used to monitor kidney function. LIVER FUNCTIONS: (Total albumin, globulin). These tests can be used in detecting and/or monitoring liver function damage, tissue damage or

ALKALINE PHOSPHATE: (Uric acid, calcium, phosphorus). Used for detection and monitoring of bone, tissue and parathyroid disease, such as arthritis, gout, bursitis and lupus. GLUCOSE: This test is to measure blood sugar

levels and is used to help diagnose/monitor dia-

CHOLESTEROL: (Including HDL, LDL, VLDL, triglycerides and ratio of LDL/HDL). These are fats produced in the liver that combine with fatty oils in the blood stream. TSH—This test is used to evaluate thyroid function and detect if there is too much or too little hormone secreted by the thyroid.
