



should not be thought of as a replacement for no-till. Instead, producers who are using conventional-tillage to plant their row crops or for those producers who have soil compaction problems after grazing their cattle on stalks, strip-till may be a good option for them. Strip-till provides some of the benefits associated with notill, while allowing more residue to accumulate on the surface compared to conventional-till.

Producers will be able to view various strip-till treatments in dryland corn, grain sorghum, and sunflower with a comparison to notill. In addition, there will be a skip row corn comparison to non-skip row corn. The plot has received more than 12 inches of rain from May through July, so the crops are looking good.
