Norton volleyball begins season

Coach Jill Lively’s Norton Community High School volleyball team opened the 2004 season on Tuesday in Norton with a victory over Osborne and a close loss to Colby.

In the third match, Colby defeated Osborne 25-20, 20-25, 25-14.

Osborne
The Lady Jays defeated Osborne 25-23, 19-25, 25-18. Norton averaged 85 percent in serving. Serve receive was 1.94 on a 3 scale and passing was 2.59. Team leaders were Whitney Newell, 92 percent; Danielle LeClair, three aces, serving; Amanda Antrim, 2.2; Klaire Mann, 2.08, serve receive; Amber Engelbert, 2.8; Rachael Lentz, 2.83, passing; Becca Ebert, 11 kills, Chelsea Cox, nine kills, hitting; Cox, 2.47; Casey Carter, 2.23, setting; Engelbert, 12 digs, defense.

“I was very pleased with how well our girls worked as a team,” said Coach Lively. “It didn’t matter what combination of players were in the match, they all gave a great effort and worked well together.

“We served 96 percent in the first game and that was a key to our momentum. Other than the statistic leaders, Pam Foley and Kylee Witt did a nice job of passing and Stacy Reeves contributed a kill and put up a consistent block. All 12 players stepped in during this match and worked hard to help us come away with the win.”

Norton lost to Colby 25-22, 25-17. The Lady Jays served 84 percent, were 1.98 in serve receive and 1.5 in passing. Team leaders were: Engelbert, 100 percent, two aces; Newell, 100 percent, serving; Mann, 3; Kylee Witt, 2.5, serve receive;

Carter, 2.67; Cox, 2.35, setting; Ebert, four kills, Newell and Cox, three kills each, hitting; Antrim, Engelbert, Lentz, six digs each, defense.

“We had several great efforts during this match; however, poor serving and a lack of confidence in serve reception really hurt us against Colby,” said Coach Lively. “Players who stepped in off the bench did a good job when the intensity was high. These included Stacy Reeves and Danielle LeClair.

“I saw a lot of things I liked about our play tonight and several areas we need to work on.”

Norton’s second competition of the season will be on Tuesday when the Lady Jay varsity and junior varsity travel to Phillipsburg to play the Lady Panthers and Lady Huskies of Northern Valley. Play begins at 5 p.m.
