year average when figuring enrollment and Mr. Mann said that Norton will probably use that for next year's budget, but with the

shrinking enrollment, the budget

is going to be smaller.

Since the 2000-'01 school year, he said, the district has had a drop of 66.8 in full-time equivalency. At \$3,863 per student, that loss totals more than one-quarter of a million dollars that the district doesn't

have to spend in the budget. He said the drop in student enrollment hasn't been a major problem yet, but it's getting to the point where it will be soon.

The enrollment numbers won't be official until Sept. 20.

Mr. Mann said despite the drop in enrollment the schools haven't dropped any activities, programs


