

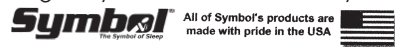

Norcatour Cereal Malt Ordinance

ORDINANCE NO. 246

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SUNDAY SALES OF CEREAL MALT BEVERAGES UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the City of Norcatour, Kansas, that:

Section 1. Sales of cereal malt beverages pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2704 are hereby authorized on Sunday in places of business which are licensed to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises which derive not less than 30% of its gross receipts from the sale of food for consumption on the licensed premises.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

Junior varsity kicks off season with a win

The Norton junior varsity football team opened the 2004 season on Tuesday with a 26-0 home victory over Oakley.

Quarterback Luke Pfannenstiel scored Norton's first touchdown in the first quarter. Norton missed the extra point and led 6-0. The Blue Jay defense held the Plainsmen deep in their territory and forced a punt. Pfannenstiel received a key block from Chris Davis as he returned the punt all the way for a touchdown. Pfannenstiel scored the two-point conversion on an option keeper and the young Jays led 14-0.

In the second quarter, a bad center snap delayed the Oakley punter and Davis sacked the punter. The freshman offense took over and scored on a pass from quarterback Logan Kats to fullback Brian Sproul. The point-after kick was blocked and the

young Jays led 20-0 at intermission.

The second half was a defensive battle but the Jays did score one more time to make the final 26-0.

"Freshman Todd Bolt had a good game on both sides of the ball with two interceptions on defense and some great runs from his tailback position," said Norton Coach Lucas Melvin. "Chris Davis also had a good game and had some monstrous hits. Brian Juenemann also recorded an inter-

ception.

"Overall, we played well. The offense moved the ball and the defense registered a shutout. Our effort was terrific, everyone seemed to play hard and that was evident by some of the big hits. If we play this hard every week, good things will happen."

The next Norton junior varsity football game will be at Plainville on Monday with kickoff set for 6:30 p.m.
