AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SUNDAY SALES OF CEREAL MALT **BEVERAGES UNDER CERTAIN** CONDITIONS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the City of Norcatur, Kansas, that:

Section 1. Sales of cereal malt beverages pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2704 are hereby authorized on Sunday in places of business which are licensed to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises which derive not less than 30% of its gross receipts from the sale of food for consumption on the licensed premises.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
