

Norton cross country team takes fifth at regional meet

Coach Deyton Hager's Norton Community High School boys cross country team placed fifth in the Class 3A Regional Cross Country Meet on Saturday in Lakin.

Norton girls also competed but did not have enough runners for a team score.

Ellsworth, the No. 1 state ranked team, placed first with 51 points, followed by No. 3 ranked Holcomb, second, 81; No. 7 ranked Lakin, third, 98; Chaparral, fourth, 102; No. 4 ranked Norton, fifth, 116; Hoisington, sixth, 121; Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays, seventh, 131; Lyons, eighth, 229; Ellinwood, ninth, 236; Cheney, tenth, 299.

The top three teams and top ten runners plus top five individuals from non-qualifying teams if they were not included in the top ten qualified for the State Meet at Wamego this Saturday.

None of the Norton boys or girls runners qualified for the state meet.

Norton senior Derek Volgamore placed 15th in 18minutes, 39.85-seconds.

Next were sophomore Logan Keiswetter, 16th. 18:45.75; sophomore Kent Mann, 19th, 18:50.77; sophomore Jared Engelbert, 33rd, 19:20.32; and junior Jeremy Harding, 39th, Also running for Norton were

Junior Karlie Jones placed 23rd for the Norton girls in 14:32.07. She was followed by junior Amber Overlease, 29th, 14:43.24; senior Crista Rhoades, 41st, 15:40.79; and sophomore Morgan Bailey, 42nd place, 15:41.11.

Cory Christensen, Medicine Lodge, won the girls championship in 12:03.77.

"This regional meet was more than just a regional," said Coach Hager. "It was pretty close to being a state meet with one or two teams not present. We did not have our best day; that is for sure. It was just not the right day for us. I know we can run so much better but we just didn't have it today.

"But, I am so proud of the boys. They have had a great year and they should hold their heads up. We were the only Norton team to win the league in the fall sports this season and we hit some other big goals, too. Winning the Wamego Meet was really good as was the championship of the Norton Invitational.

"Our girls needed to run their best times of the season if they were to go on to the state meet this year. Karlie and Amber didn't get out and run like I know they can. Crista ran a very good time, just edging Morgan at the finish. Our girls also had a good season with some good individual finishes.

"We will lose just Derek and Crista to graduation this year and we will miss both of them. Their leadership has really come out and helped us this season. Derek will be especially hard to replace but I am sure someone will step up and take
