Incumbent retains job in House against Democratic opponent

Incumbent State Representative economic development. John Faber of Brewster retained his seat in the Kansas House by taking almost two votes for every one cast for his Democratic opponent Bob Strevey of Norcatur.

Rep. Faber received 6,662 votes to Mr. Strevey's 3,609.

Mr. Strevey was able to take Decatur, his home county, by 534 to 423 votes but lost in all other areas of the 120th District, which is heavily Republican.

Mr. Faber won Norton County 1,364-1,188 and took Cheyenne, 1,282 to 356; Rawlins, 1,364 to 354; and Phillips, 1,766 to 888.

In the primary Mr. Faber beat Norton County attorney Doug Sebelius 3,404 to 2,375. Two years ago he ran against Mr. Strevey also. This will be Mr. Faber's fifth term in the house.

In education, he said, he is worried about what the supreme court might do and whether the state will drop the low-enrollment weighting formula, which is essential to keeping several small schools in western Kansas going.

He said that he hopes to work with Mr. Strevey, a former teacher, to work on the school finance problems. He said that he hopes Mr. Strevey might be able to go to Topeka to testify when hearings are held on the subject.

On economic development he said that there is a lot to do but the good news is that the state has seen an increase in revenues in October and the economy seems to be on the rebound.

With a better economy, he said, perhaps the state can shore up some of the government projects its been putting off the last couple of years.
