# Applesauce helps keep cake moist

Most of Mama's recipes were word-of-mouth and learn by watching and doing but one of the family favorites I do have in her own handwriting.

The card is yellowed and tattered, spotted here and there with bits of various ingredients, and embellished with little notes.

Mama always called this Florence's cake and Aunt Florence called it Edith's cake, so I don't

know its exact origin. What I do know is that never a Christmas passed without this cake being baked by both and taken to every family dinner, where Mama and Florence compared and each declared the other's best.

The applesauce ingredient called for here is not that mushy stuff from the grocery store. Mama canned her own apples and that is what is used here, just mashed up a bit so there are nice hunks of apple throughout the batter. If you do not have canned apples, peel and cook enough Rome beauties or jonathans in a very small amount of light sugar water until they soften enough for a quick, chunky mash.

### THE CAFFERTY SISTERS APPLESAUCE CAKE

1 1/2 sticks of unsalted butter  
1 1/2 cups white sugar  
4 tablespoons dark brown sugar  
2 large eggs  
1 1/2 cups steamed raisins  
1 1/2 cups chunky applesauce  
4 tablespoons hot raisin juice  
1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts  
1/2 cup chopped dates  
1/2 cup chopped prunes  
2 teaspoons baking soda  
2 teaspoons cinnamon  
1 teaspoon each nutmeg, cloves, allspice and salt  
3 cups flour

Combine softened butter, sugars and eggs until smooth, add raisins, applesauce, raisin juice, nuts, dates and prunes. Stir up very well. Sift together the flour and spices and work into the fruit mixture a bit at a time. Batter will be stiff. If too stiff, add more hot raisin juice, a tablespoonful at a time, until batter can be smoothed into a 9-inch-by-13-inch glass pan.

Bake at 350 degrees for an hour. May also bake in small loaf pans or in muffin cups for about 25 minutes.

Mama usually served this unfrosted but on special occasions she used a caramel flavored buttercream spread on it. The recipe includes the topping below but I don't remember ever using it.

### Optional Topping:

Before baking, crumb this mixture with your fingers and sprinkle over top:

1/2 cup crushed corn flakes  
1/4 cup brown sugar  
2 tablespoons butter  
1/4 chopped walnuts

This is a very heavy, solid cake but moist. It will keep for weeks if tightly covered and kept cool.
