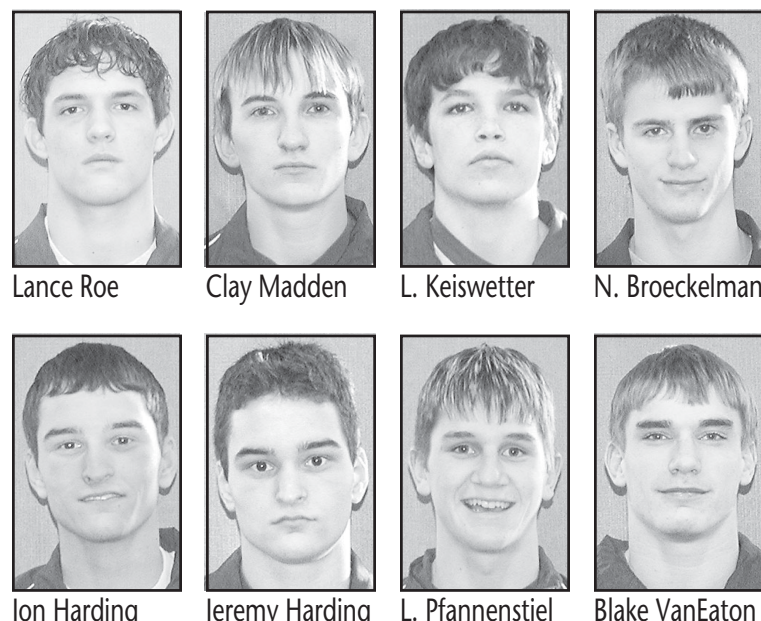


Nine Norton wrestlers named all area

Nine members of the Norton Community High School state champion wrestling team were chosen to the 2005 All-Area Wrestling Team by the Salina Journal newspaper.
Senior Michael Sprigg, 275-pound Class 3-2-1A state champion, and junior Lance Roe, 152-pound state champion, were named to the first team.
Sprigg compiled a school record 37-0 mark en route to his second state championship and fourth state medal.
Roe earned a 37-1 record and won his third state tournament medal.
Chosen for the second team was junior Clay Madden, 112, who won his third state championship and had a 33-3 season record.
Named honorable mention were sophomore Logan Keiswetter, 103; sophomore Nathan Broeckelman, 119; junior Jon Harding, 130; junior Jeremy Harding, 135; junior Luke Pfannenstiel, 140 and sophomore Blake VanEaton, 145.
Keiswetter placed fourth in the state tournament and compiled a 30-8 record.
Broeckelman placed third in the state tournament and finished with a 30-8 record. He placed second in his freshman season.
Jon Harding finished sixth and was 30-12 for the season.

Jeremy Harding placed fifth and compiled a 28-9 mark.
Pfannenstiel placed fourth in the state and his season record was 31-4. He was injured last season but placed fifth at 112 pounds his freshman season.
VanEaton finished sixth and compiled a 27-16 mark.

due to the extreme cold, wet, freezing conditions accompanied by strong winds.
