# Blue Jay boys defeat Oberlin Red Devils 59-24

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School varsity boys basketball team returned from Christmas break much sharper than the Oberlin Red Devils and the result was a 59-24 win for Norton Tuesday night in the NCHS Memorial Gym in Norton.

The Blue Jays extended their season record to 3-2. Oberlin has won only one game this season.

Norton outshot Oberlin from the field 47 percent to 27 percent and outrebounded the visiting Red Devils 35-20.

In the first quarter, Norton outscored Oberlin 17-3. Nic Lewis led the way for the Blue Jays with two baskets and a free throw. Wes Georgeson hit a basket and two charities. Heath Vincent scored one basket. Nathan Morse and Jared Engelbert each hit a long range shot in the period.
