Norton girls defeat Trego in basketball league play

In their final game before the annual Mid-Continent League Tournament, Coach Kevin Jilka's Norton Community High School girls basketball team defeated Trego Community 57-25 in a league game played here Friday

The win extended Norton's unbeaten record to 8-0.

Norton got off to a good start by taking a 15-4 lead after one quarter but outscored Trego by just 7-6 in the second period to take a 22-10 halftime advantage. A 13-8 third quarter in Norton's favor extended their lead to 35-18.

The Lady Jays ended on a strong note by outscoring the Lady Golden Eagles 22-7 in the fourth quarter to win by 32 points.

In the opening quarter, senior guard Karlie Jones was on target from long range as she buried two three-point shots and added a free throw. Senior guards Klaire Mann and Amber Overlease scored period. Senior centers Chelsea 50 percent accuracy. Cox and Becca Ebert each hit 2 of 2 free throws.

Trego jumped out to a 16-9 first quarter lead and was ahead 33-18 at halftime but the Blue Jays didn't give up. Norton came battling back to outscore the Golden Eagles 13-9 in the third quarter to cut the Trego lead down to 11 points at 42-31 with one quarter remaining.

Trego took charge in the final stanza, however, hitting the first nine points to stretch their advantage to 20 points. The rest of the way, Norton fouled in an attempt to get the ball but the Golden Eagles hit their free throws and extended their final lead to 26 points.
