## Blue Jay boys lose to Trego in tourney finals

The No.4 seeded Norton Community High School boys basketball team upset No.1 seed Plainville in the semi-finals of the annual Mid-Continent League Basketball Tournament on Friday night but was unable to do the same against No.2 seed and defending champion Trego, falling 60-42 in Saturday's championship finals in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays.

Norton is now 8-3 for the season and Trego extended their record to

Carrying over some momentum from the exciting win over Plainville, the Blue Jays held a slim 12-11 lead after one quarter but were outscored 16-8 in the second quarter to fall behind 27-20 at intermission. Trego outpointed Norton by just 14-12 in the third quarter, thanks to a long, threepoint basket by Norton sophomore guard Logan Kats at the buzzer, but still led 41-32 with one period left. The Golden Eagles outscored the Blue Jays 19-10 in the fourth quarter to win by 18.

Three-point baskets by senior guard Nathan Morse and junior guard Jared Engelbert helped Norton in the first quarter. Senior center Heath Vincent hit a basket and junior center Nic Lewis and Morse each hit two free throws.

## Norton beats No. 1 seed in semi-finals

Coach Doug Reusink's No.4 seeded Norton Community High School boys basketball team played their best game of the season to defeat No.1 seed Plainville 56-55 on Friday night in Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays in the semi-finals of the Mid-Continent League Tournament.

Norton extended their season record to 7-3 and Plainville dropped to 10-2.

The Blue Jays trailed 17-8 after one quarter but outscored Plainville 20-6 in the second period to take a 28-23 halftime lead. Plainville edged Norton 19-17 in the high scoring third quarter but still trailed Norton 45-42. Plainville took the lead early in

the fourth quarter when senior guard Justin Casey hit two free throws and a three-point shot in the first two minutes to put the Cardinals on top 47-45. Norton senior guard Nathan Morse scored for the Blue Jays and it was 47-all with 4:48 left. Senior forward Brock McDowell scored for the Cardinals but sophomore forward Wes Georgeson scored inside for the Jays to tie it again at 49-all with 4:10 remaining.

McDowell hit two more baskets and Plainville led 53-49 with 3:21 left. Senior center Heath Vincent scored inside for Norton and it was 53-51. Sophomore guard Logan Kats stole the ball and drove down court. He passed to Morse and he buried a shot from beyond the arc to put Norton on top 54-53 with 2:34 remaining.

Casey stole the ball for Plainville and scored at the 1:47 mark to put the Cardinals on top 55-54. Norton came down court, shot and missed and Plainville got the rebound. The Cardinals went into a slow down game but the aggressive Norton defense caused them to throw the ball away with 38 seconds left.

Norton brought the ball down



to put Norton ahead 56-55!

Casey drove toward the basket but was fouled before he could shoot. He stepped to the free throw line with 1.1 seconds on the scoreboard clock. His shot bounced off the rim, giving the Blue Jays a 56-55 victory and berth in Saturday's championship finals contest against Trego Com-

Georgeson and junior center Nic Lewis each hit a basket and free throw and Vincent swished one basket for Norton in the first quarter. McDowell had a big first quarter for Plainville as he hit three baskets and a free throw. Taylor Dix hit athree-point and two-point basket, Josh Brungardt hit a basket and basket. Plainville scored the last four points of the quarter to extend the Cardinals' lead to 9 points.

The Blue Jays gave notice in the second quarter that they would not go away. Vincent hit two quick baskets to start the quarter and narrow the Plainville lead to 17-12. Taylor Dix hit a three-pointer but Kats matched it for Norton with 3:57 left. Mick hit a free throw but Vincent hit two charities to make it 21-17 with 3:23 left. Georgeson hit a bank shot, Plainville turned the ball over and sophomore center Jared Cox 19 points, followed by Taylor Dix, scored inside to tie the score at 21all with 2:26 left.

"I'm very, very proud of our players," said Coach Reusink. We played harder as the game progressed; we played with emotion. Heath Vincent made some big plays inside and Nathan Morse hit some key shots from long range but everyone played well. Jared Engelbert came through with a big charity and Dalton Mick swished a three-point basket just before halftime that gave us some momen-

Vincent led Norton in scoring with 17 points on 6 of 14 shots from the field for 43 percent and 5 of 6 free throws for 83 percent. Morse added 10 points on 2 of 6 shots from beyond the arc for 33 percent, 2 of 5 two-point baskets for 40 percent and 4 of 11 overall for 36 percent. Georgeson hit 9 points on 4 of 7 from the field for 57 percent and 1 of 2 free throws for 50 percent. McDowell led Plainville with

16 and Casey, 10.
